


I smell spring right around the corner. Have you noticed the geese are pairing up? By Feb. 15 we should start seeing Sandhill Cranes. Western Blue Birds will be right behind the cranes. With spring just around the corner we are planning a **free** pack clinic to help us prepare for one of our BLM projects. Sam Burrows and Larry Shuman from the Shasta-Trinity Unit, very experienced packers in their own right, will be coming to Alturas on April 27 and 28 to teach beginning and odd load packing classes.

Several projects underway contribute to resource restoration, camps and backcountry trail improvements. Descriptions of a few projects follow:

BLM Lost Creek Fire Fence Restoration This project offers an opportunity for HCU members to volunteer packing assistance for moving fencing materials into remote areas damaged by the Lost Fire. Approximately 6 miles of a 40 mile fence can be accessed only by pack stock. May is the target date for implementing this project.


HCU plans a **Pack Clinic** in Alturas on April 27 & 28. Making the pack clinic a public day serves as a membership recruitment effort too. Sam Burrow and Larry Shurman, BCHC leaders from Redding, offered to teach at the pack clinic in Alturas. HCU members will also have an opportunity learning about Dutch Oven cooking as lunch will be prepared using Dutch Ovens.

MNF RAC Projects for 2013

High Grade Trail Interpretive Signing and Trail Work The High Grade Trail is located in the Warner Mountains, east of the Buck Creek Guard Station. Trail signage & interpretative signs were ordered last fall. Installing the signs is planned for this summer. Kerry Davis is the HCU lead for this project.

Soup Springs Campground is scheduled for new corrals this year, in addition to the corrals that were repaired last summer.

RAC funding was earmarked for **East Creek Trail** clearing last summer. An in-service agreement between Forests brought Ken Graves and crew to the MNF. They cleared portions of the trail. Additional trail clearing is planned for 2013.



East Creek Trail — Many more downed logs await clearing on this trail. Some people pay to work out at a gym or buy expensive exercise equipment. Some people diet to lose extra weight. Why not join the work parties to clear this wilderness trail using cross cut saws? For the cost of camping, you can turn excess pounds into buff muscles while eating good healthy food.


Forest Service staff marked the trail last year and cleared part of the trail. Let's open the rest of this trail this year!

BCHC HCU General Meeting Notes December 8, 2012

The BCHC HCU meeting was held at the Niles Hotel in Alturas.

Lots of informal conversation took place as members enjoyed a social and an excellent dinner. Copies of the agenda, an annual report and ballots were available. Maps were on display on the Unit display board.

The meeting was **called to order** at 8:15 PM by Alan Cain, President. Alan welcomed members and guests. Alan asked for agenda updates. Cindy and Kimberly each asked for agenda time under new business.

Guests included: Amy Hartell (Modoc National Forest Recreation Officer), Dan Dockery, Modoc National Forest volunteer.

HCU members present included: Alan & Jeannie Cain, LuRena Sylva, Clarence & Dolores Wager, Cindy & Sam McMurry, Sharon Enderlin, Edie Asrow, Michael & Kimberly Anderson, Valerie & Glenn Lantz, Pete & Sandy Jansen, Laurel Marsters, Harry & Jean Weir.

Correspondence - none.

Minutes from HCU Meeting of September, **2012**. Valerie stated that DRAFT meeting notes were included in the Fall Newsletter which allowed lots of opportunity for everyone to review them. Cindy moved to approve the meeting notes. A second by Harry was supported with unanimous approval for the minutes to be accepted as presented.

Treasurer's Report: LuRena provided a printed Treasurer's report (see attached).

Old Business:

<u>Project reports:</u> Amy presented a PowerPoint that included photos from several 2012 MNF projects, including the Owl Creek Trail, High Grade Trail, Red Tail Rim Trail, East Creek Trail, and Soup Springs Horse Camp.

Amy said the Region 5 top pick for the annual Forest Service Trail Group Volunteer Award includes the High Country Unit.

Laurel reported that the Lassen National Forest rebuilt the Cone Lake Corral at the edge of the Caribou Wilderness. She said the Lassen Sheriff's Posse may have funding for other corral building.

New Business:

Kimberly, speaking as the Modoc National Forest Supervisor, thanked the High Country Unit for the support and dedicated volunteering from the High Country Unit members.

Upcoming project planning - Amy said that grant funding is available from the

National Forest Foundation through the Wilderness Stewardship Program. Amy asked for assistance from the HCU to prepare a grant application as a MNF partner. Projects already in the works for 2013 include Soup Springs corral installation, sign installation on the High Grade Trail, Red Tail Rim trail clearing (logs) and clearing large logs from the East Creek Trail. Amy said the American Hiking Association is planning a trip to the Warner Mountains in August 2013. This is an opportunity to demonstrate positive stock use to serious hikers. Amy reported that the Modoc National Forest retired its remaining horse stock. Planning for replacements or revising a stock use program will be considered this winter.

Cindy presented a PowerPoint that illustrated a BLM project that offers an opportunity for HCU members to volunteer packing assistance for moving fencing materials into remote areas damaged by the Lost Fire. Approximately 6 miles of a 40 mile fence can be accessed only by pack stock. May is the target date for implementing this project. Cindy suggested that the HCU plan a Pack Clinic in Alturas during April. Making the pack clinic a public day could serve as a membership recruitment effort too. Sam Burrow and Larry Shurman, BCHC leaders from Redding, offered to teach at such a pack clinic in Alturas. HCU members will also have an opportunity for learning packing and other back country skills at the BCHC Rendezvous on March 22-24, 2013 in Norco and/or *The Wild Wilderness Weekend*, a (continued from page 6)

BCHC event held in Red Bluff on April 5 - 7, 2013. Cindy distributed flyers for each of these events. The HCU is committed to helping in the office at the Red Bluff event. Please contact Cindy to sign up or help plan these events. Cindy also reported on the BCHC State meeting held in October. BCHC plans to activate a new website by the first of the new year. BCHC has grants available for Unit Education Programs and Trail Projects that contain educational components. The State meeting included interesting presentations about the Pacific Crest Trail (PCT) organization and about One Spade Packers, a youth program.

2013 Officers - Election ballots were filled out and gathered. Alan Cain write-in's were present on all

ballots. 50% of members were represented by the ballots gathered (three were received via USPS mail). The officers elected for 2013 are the same as those serving in 2012.


